- 7. Although not ratified until 1992, Madison was the main author. Twelve amendments were adopted by Congress in 1789, with ten swiftly ratified and known as the Bill of Rights.

- 10. No, but Madison helped care for her only surviving son, two-year-old John Payne Todd. John Todd, Dolley's first husband, and their infant son William, died during a yellow fever epidemic in 1793.

- 14. The key Battle of New Orleans was fought on January 8, 1815, two weeks after the December 24, 1814, signing of the treaty of Ghent. However, the treaty was not ratified and exchanged by the British and Americans until February 17, 1815, at the Octagon House in Washington, D.C.
